This email was updated on **Friday 23 January 2009**.

Here are the results of the routine sampling **event 242** which was conducted **Monday 19 and Tuesday 20 January 2008**.

- *Dinophysis cf fortii* was detected at Pinnacle Channel harvesting area, but in low numbers only.
- *Pseudo-nitzschia* spp. was detected at Clifton Springs and Grassy Point harvesting areas, but in low numbers only.

These results are below the trigger levels, and no action is required.

#### Seawater temperatures at harvesting areas:
